Going Through A Wilderness

Throughout the Bible, individuals went in and out of wilderness experiences. Today, we are doing the same thing.

It seems to be linked to God wanting to take us through “testing” to make us stronger and not weaker.

To us, it seems like punishment.

To us, it seems like God is not listening.

We must come to a **denial** of self and a return to a **God-centeredness** with our lives.

Then God has us where He can accomplish **through us the purposes** He had before He created the world. Though more could be said, here are some descriptions of the life orientations available to you:

Luke 4:1-2 reads, “Jesus, **full of the Holy Spirit**, left the Jordan and was **led by the Spirit** into the wilderness, ² where for forty days he was tempted by the devil.”

Luke 4:13, “When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left him **until an opportune time.**”

Matthew 4:11 reads, “Then the devil left him, and **angels came and attended him.**”

We can learn much from these passages.

#1 - When we are the weakest from illness, stress, family situations or work, we are most vulnerable. Be ready, the down-time is coming.

#2 - When we are heading into troubled times, we need the “comforter - Holy Spirit to **FILL** us with **His Power**.”

#3 - With God’s grace the experience will strengthen us and we will come out in the **POWER** of the Holy Spirit.

#4 - While in the wilderness, we know that Satan will do everything possible to distract and lie to us about what we are experiencing.

So, what causes chaos and confusion in our hearts?

Self-centeredness:

- life focused on self
- proud of self and self’s accomplishments
- self confidence



- depending on self and one’s own abilities
- affirming self
- seeking to be acceptable to the world and its ways
- looking at circumstances from a human perspective

God-centeredness:

- confidence in God
- dependence on God and His ability and provision
- life focused on God and His activity
- humble before God
- denying self
- seeking first the kingdom of God and His righteousness
- seeking God’s perspective in every circumstance
- holy and godly living

Where does that leave us?

Face to face with Satan spewing out lies. But with God at our side and the Word of God in our hearts, we **KNOW** the truth and the truth will set us free.

It may be very uncomfortable. Then at the end, God’s power will minister to us.

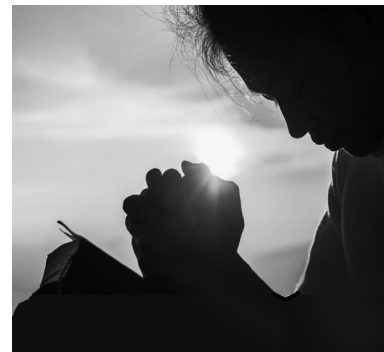
