

## 4-F's of Prison Ministry Mentoring

When you visit an inmate - talk about:

### **FAMILY - FRIENDS - FELLOWSHIP AND FREEDOM**

- **Family** - understanding what has happened to his family
- **Friends** - understanding the selection of friends
- **Fellowship** - understanding the need for good fellowship
- **Freedom** - understanding what happens when free



### **FAMILY**

An inmate is often so focused on his problems that he doesn't see what his wife, brothers, sisters and members of his family are going through. More often than not, incarceration is more difficult for the family than the inmate. Offenders have the meals, shelter and medical attention, while the family may be in need.

During the visit, it is good to discuss family and talk about THEIR NEEDS. Discuss his/her life as a child and his/her feeling toward the family and what it means to have a supportive family. Role model how a family should help each other, by explaining good family relationships.

#### **Scriptures:**

Acts 16:33-34 "At that hour of the night the jailer took them and washed their wounds; then immediately he and all his family were baptized. (34) The jailer brought them into his house and set a meal before them; he was filled with joy because he had come to believe in God --he and his whole family."

Mark 5:18-20, "As Jesus was getting into the boat, the man who had been demon- possessed begged to go with him. (19) Jesus did not let him, but said, "Go home to your family and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you." (20) So the man went away and began to tell in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him. And all the people were amazed."

I am sure Jesus was excited, when he saw the man's concern for his family. Inmates can encourage their families in the things of the Lord, maybe even more than the family can encourage them. Have you ever gone to visit someone who was sick and come away being the one who was encouraged?

**Scripture:** Proverbs. 11:29, "He who brings trouble on his family will inherit only wind, and the fool will be servant to the wise."

### **FRIENDS**

All of us, at some time or another, have had friends who were bad influence. For your own review, write down the name of a friend who mistreated you.


- To continue the review, write down what you, or someone else did to make that relationship break apart.
- Think through your life and write down the number of times you have changed your circle of friends, maybe because of a move or maybe because of your accepting Christ. Many inmates are in prison because of bad friends or associates who got them into trouble.

**John 15:12-15**, "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. (13) Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends. (14) You are my friends if you do what I command. (15) I no longer

*call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you."*

## FELLOWSHIP

The dictionary defines fellowship as: companionship, friendliness, comradeship and sharing.

- Companionship - one who goes along or accompanies another.
- Friendliness - having a kind attitude toward another person.
- Comradeship - a companion or friend with a professional understanding.
- Sharing - exchanging thoughts and experiences.

We have taken "fellowship" to mean, the gathering after church. It really means: *the personal close relationship between two or more people.*

It is possible to be in an auditorium of people and not have any fellowship. I like to define fellowship as two or more people sitting around and enjoying each others company. It is an exchange of ideas, knowledge,

feelings and just getting to know each other personally.

**Scripture:** 1 John 1:3 and 7 - "We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ." (7) "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin."

**Fellowship is closely tied to friendship.** A strong understanding of having good friends is necessary, because our friends are the ones with whom we have fellowship. As a Christian, we have a responsibility to fellowship with believers.

### FREEDOM

Freedom is something every inmate wants to hear about. They want to discuss the number of times they have been turned down by the parole board or the freedom that has been taken away from them. Their legal freedom is something you cannot help them with. It is in the hands of the court and their lawyer, BUT there is a deeper inner freedom, with which you can help.

Inmates will either seek ways to restore and make restitution or they will fight and fight and get deeper and deeper in hate.

Freedom through parole, is what the inmate works for, but freedom in Christ can be a spiritual freedom that chains cannot hold captive.

**Freedom is an attitude and not a place.** Paul wrote, (Philippians 4:11) "whatever condition I am in, I have learned to be content." It meant: whatever condition, whether I like it or not, a person is to be content, not necessarily happy, but able to cope with the problems.

Doctors have proven that if a person is unhappy, he/she will be unhappy no matter what job, marriage or condition of finances they may have. People can be unhappy with a steak dinner, not because they don't like steak, but because something is bothering them.

**Happiness and freedom of spirit are NOT based on situations but on the attitude of the heart and the spirit.**

**It is our job to see people have the opportunity to be set FREE through the love of Jesus Christ.**

### THE GREATEST FREEDOM!

In a believer's life, there is a time when a person asks Jesus to forgive their sins and then commit themselves 100% to Him.

It involves asking Him to forgive and take the load of sin from you, saying to Jesus, "I believe You are the Son of God and You died for me." Then a person can feel His presence with a peace that cannot be described.
