God's Power and Glory for America

hen Psalm 136 was written, as a reminder of God's endless love and what God had accomplished. It was the main song of the children of Israel. Whether in battle or in worship, it would bring down the Glory of God. God's love, justice, mercy, and grace are unending — BECAUSE— His love endures forever.

Here are two examples of the POWER of this song to defeat the enemy and the anointing of God to overwhelm the people.

2 Chronicles 5:13b-14 — "Accompanied by trumpets, cymbals and other instruments, the singers raised their voices in praise to the Lord and sang: 'He is good; His love endures forever.' Then the temple of the Lord was filled with the cloud, and the priests could not perform their service because of the cloud, for the glory of the Lord filled the temple of God."

Some translations read that the priests fell like dead men to the floor and could not perform their duties.

The other example was when the children of Israel were about to go into battle and instead of sending the warriors, God told Jehoshaphat send the musicians.

2 Chronicles 25:21, "After consulting the people, Jehoshaphat appointed men to sing to the Lord and to praise him for the splendor of his holiness as they went out at the head of the army, saying: "Give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures forever."

There are only 44 times in the Old Testament, the phrase "For His love endures forever." 1 Chronicles — twice; 2 Chronicles – four times; Ezra and Jeremiah— only once; Psalm — thirty-six times.

The first nine (9) verses of Psalm 136 give us the backdrop of why it was written, to bring GLORY to God for His many marvelous works. I have written, what could be a 21st century rendition of verses 10-21, that would apply to America today.



PSALM 136 for AMERICA TODAY

- 10 To Him who led the forefathers to America. His love endures forever.
- 11 Who brought the people needed to establish government. His love endures forever.
- 12 He encouraged native tribes to help the people survive. His love endures forever.
- 13 To Him who appointed leaders to make everlasting decisions. His love endures forever.
- 14 He established members of the new congress to write decrees. His love endures forever.
- 15 He allowed to defeat enemies who swept in with vengeance. His love endures forever.
- 16 To Him, who lead His people through the unknown wilderness. His love endures forever.
- 17 To Him, who struck down wicked people from other countries. His love endures forever.
- 18 He taught His people how to resist government dominant rule. His love endures forever.
- 19 He allowed people to resist high taxes with a tea party. His love endures forever.
- 20 He established one Nation under God, indivisible. His love endures forever.
- 21 With justice and liberty for all. His love endures forever and ever.


